

A Letter from the President

2022 was an important year for JASM. After two long years of holding events online and outdoors only, we started meeting face to face. Our first in-person event was the Harukaze spring music festival in June. It was quite emotional for me to get together with so many old and new friends at Sundin Hall to see an inspiring and, at times, humorous performance by three Minnesota-based artists: Rie Tanaka, pianist; Yuki Tokuda, classical ballet dancer; and Jesse Nummelin, cellist.

This was followed by the O-bon festival at Como Park in August. Over 7000 visitors attended, and dozens of JASM volunteers gave them an authentic summer festival experience by staffing booths featuring calligraphy, yo-yo fishing, J-Quiz, and festival merchandise.

In September, we held the second annual JASM Charity Golf Tournament, organized by JASM members Tom Haeg and Marc Blehert. Participation nearly doubled from 2021 and they even managed to convince outspoken golf critic Bob Luck to join in. My verdict? It was a blast! Rumor has it that Executive Director Rio Saito is on Tom and Marc's hit list for 2023.

In November, we held the Mondale Award and Scholarship Dinner at the Oak Ridge Country Club. I must admit that I was nervous about attendance: would people really return to an in-person dinner when they got so accustomed to take-out during the pandemic? I didn't need to worry. Attendance was strong, not least because so many people wanted to see 2022 Mondale Award winners Gayle and Judith Fleming receive their award, including two tables of family members! I am thankful to all who attended the event and generously supported our Mondale scholarship fund through donations and participation in the silent auction.

We continued the strong online presence that we developed during the pandemic, hosting events that showed many facets of Japan from tattooing to baseball cheering to textiles. Online events have been a silver lining of the pandemic, as they have made JASM accessible to a wider audience within and outside the Twin Cities Metro area. We intend to develop our online offerings further in 2023, and work to develop hybrid events that can be attended online or in-person.

We received a record number of applications for Mondale scholarships by Minnesota-based college students who wish to study in Japan. Due to the generosity of our members and supporters, we were able to match this surge in applications by awarding a record number of five scholarships, while significantly increasing the average size of the award. One of the greatest privileges of serving as JASM president is participating on the Mondale Awards committee. I was amazed at the diversity, accomplishments, and passion of all the candidates we interviewed.

As you will see from the enclosed Treasurer's Report, we are in a strong financial position. As we entered the pandemic, we took aggressive cost control measures, including closing our physical office and asking our staff to work from home, which, despite some personal hardship, they willingly agreed to do. Thank you, Rio-san and Yoko-san! We were also able to take advantage of government support programs related to the pandemic. Those programs have expired, but we successfully replaced them with grants for several program-related events in 2022. Throughout this challenging period, the financial support of our members and supporters has been critical. Thank you!

We saw some major changes on our Board of Directors. After serving for three years as President of JASM, Elizabeth Fehrman retired from the Board at the end of 2021. Our treasurer, Yoko Torigoe, retired in November, 2022. I would like to thank them for their service during a particularly challenging time in JASM's history. Thanks as well to Masako Yoshida, Motoko Hioki, and Sukanya Momsen, who left the board in 2022. A warm welcome to our new treasurer, Mio Ishida, and to new board members Saiko McIvor, Lydia Rose, and Kat Dalager. This month, we will elect three additional board members! Thanks to everybody who submitted a nomination.

In 2022, we celebrated our 50th Anniversary. I believe there are three important factors that have brought us this far:

- 1. We have an important and inspiring mission, to connect Minnesota and Japan.
- 2. We have adapted to change, most recently, the enormous changes brought about by the COVID pandemic.
- 3. Finally, we are blessed with dedicated staff, members, and supporters. Thank you for getting us through our 50 years. I look forward to the next 50!


